Why Do We Celebrate the Divine Liturgy Every Sunday?

When we go to church on Sunday, it resembles going to Christ's gravesite. We visit His gravesite and celebrate the Divine Liturgy on the stone, the Holy Altar, which anchors our lives. There we witness the sunrise of our lives, our Lord's resurrection from death, light rising from the darkness. He rescued us from the darkness of death. In other words, we bring our sins and suffering to Him, die with Him on the Holy Cross, and we rise with Him, free of sin. Every Sunday, we leave the church as a new, resurrected person.
